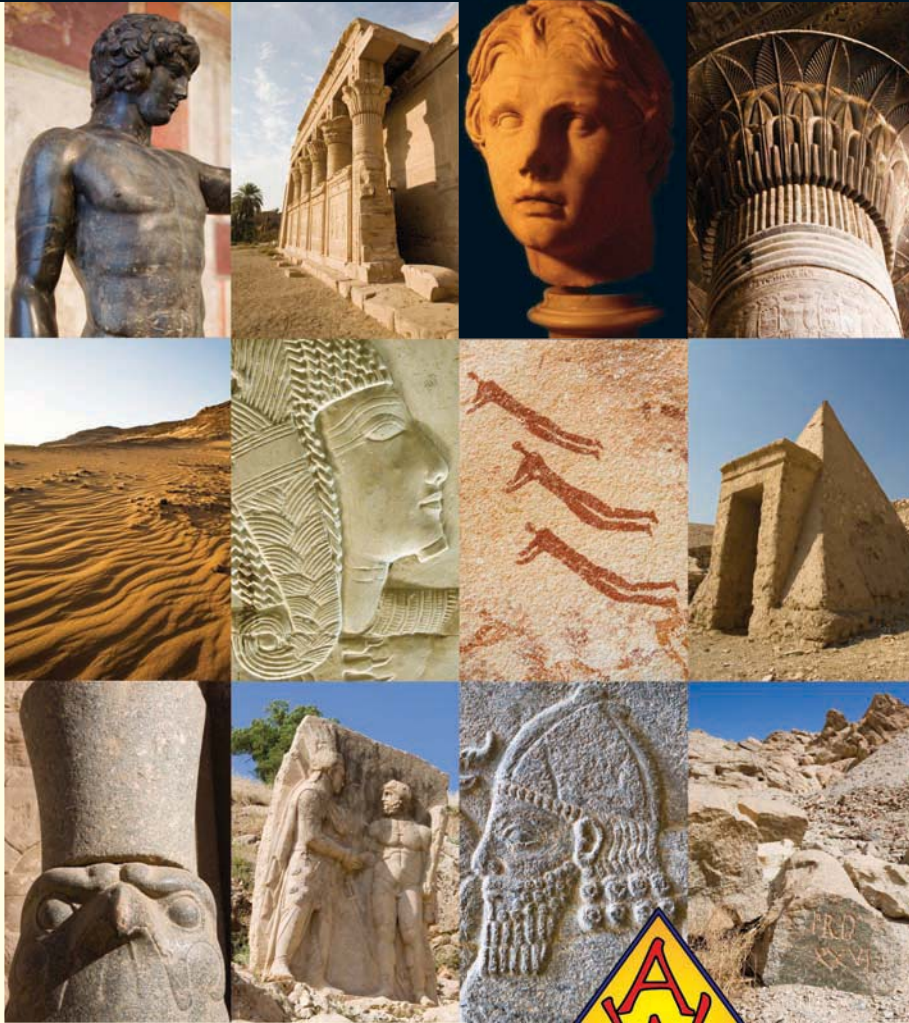
A JOINT VENTURE WITH THE FRIENDS OF THE PETRIE MUSEUM

A map with location and advice on travel, will be sent out with tickets, about two weeks prior to the event to everyone that books.

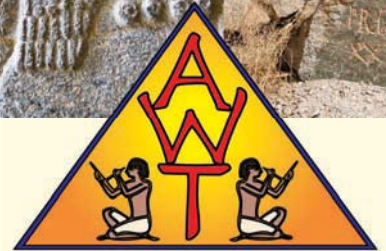
