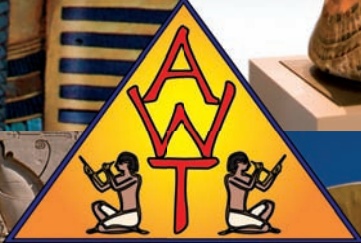
THE ANCIENT WORLD CONFERENCE
